

Information related to the German Supply Chain Due Diligence Act (LkSG)

Dear Business Partner,

Sandvik Mining and Construction Central Europe GmbH and its affiliated companies are committed to using high-end engineering and innovation to enable the rapid transition to a sustainable business model. By integrating sustainability into the business model and way of working, Sandvik creates value for society as a whole.

As Sandvik Mining and Construction Central Europe GmbH, we ensure the effectiveness of our sustainable business practices. To achieve this, it is important that mandatory practices are integrated throughout our supply chain. This includes not only setting strict standards for our own operations, but also requiring our suppliers and other business partners to adhere to responsible environmental and social criteria.

All business relations between Sandvik and our suppliers must be based on transparency, trust, and cooperation. It is important for us to partner with suppliers who understand and embrace our sustainability standards. The standards are about protecting the environment, mitigating climate change, building circularity as well as respecting human and labor rights and committing to conducting business with high ethical integrity. Our comprehensive set of policies and procedures support us in our work to identify, prevent, mitigate, and account for adverse environmental, human rights and governance impacts from our supply chain, and outlines the rules for evaluating and approving a supplier as compliant with the Sandvik Supplier Code of Conduct in order to qualify as a Sandvik supplier. Sustainability risk screening, and risks of violation of the Sandvik Supplier Code is a key area of Sustainable Supplier Management at Sandvik.

As our parent company Sandvik Holding GmbH has been within the scope of the LkSG since 2023, we also already comply with the human rights and environmental due diligence obligations of the LkSG due to our own legal obligation. At the same time, we naturally understand that our business partners, who also fall within the scope of the LkSG, rely on our cooperation in order to fulfill their obligations with regard to their suppliers. As far as necessary, we are of course happy to support our business partners in this regard and, in particular, provide the information required for an LkSG risk analysis.

To implement our human rights and environmental commitments, we use a standardized risk management process with clear organizational responsibilities and measurable KPIs to monitor our performance. Our process is regularly adapted as part of our continuous improvement process.

We hope that this information is sufficient for you to determine, in accordance with BAFA's guidelines on [risk analysis](#) and [cooperation in the supply chain](#), that Sandvik Mining and Construction Central Europe GmbH is not a high-risk supplier from the perspective of the LkSG. Accordingly, there is no further obligation on your part to specifically identify possible risks at Sandvik Mining and Construction Central Europe GmbH or even to take preventive measures in accordance with § 6 LkSG. Answering any questionnaire in connection with an LkSG risk analysis, the adoption of a supplier code of conduct with LkSG requirements or the agreement of a contractual clause with LkSG requirements are therefore, in our view, neither legally required nor necessary due to other risk considerations.
